

360,000 in 62 Countries and Regions to Take the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test on December 2

The Japanese-Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) has a 28 year history and is the largest comprehensive test of Japanese-language skills for non-native speakers. This time, we welcome Israel and Iran as new sites for the JLPT test, which will take place in 201 cities in 62 countries and regions.

December 2012 JLPT

- 1. Test Date: Sunday, December 2, 2012
- 2. Test Sites: 201 cities in 61 countries and regions abroad, 42 prefectures in Japan
- 3. Test Levels: N1~N5 (5 levels with N1 being the highest)
- 4. Number of Applicants:

Over 356,000 people (Approximately 284,000 abroad and 73,000 in Japan)

- •New countries for the JLPT: Iran, Israel
- •New cities for the JLPT:

Ann Arbor, Houston (U.S.A), Astana (Kazakhstan), Jerusalem (Israel), Perm (Russia), Santiago de Compostela (Spain), Tehran (Iran), and Aomori, Miyazaki (Japan)

Ways to Utilize JLPT Certificates

- Points granted for preferential treatment in Japan's emigration and immigration management of highly skilled foreign professionals (N1)
- ✓ Japan-Vietnam EPA: Selection criterion for immigration of nurses and care workers (N3 or higher)
- Certified qualification for taking the National Medical Practitioners Qualifying Examination organized by the Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare (N1)
- ✓ Certified qualification for taking the Practical Nurse Licensing Examination (N1)
- ✓ Preferential treatment at universities, job placement, etc.
