Now that the conference is only days away, we are sending you this email with information that will come in handy, especially if you are coming from abroad.

- Please take a moment to check out the websites of the newlylaunched <u>Centre for the Global Study of Japan</u> at the Munk School, and <u>Japan Futures Initiative (JFI)</u> at the University of Waterloo.
- For transportation from Pearson International Airport to downtown Toronto, an option is the airport limo that costs approximately CAD\$70 (including tip). Another option is the new Union-Pearson Express train, however it departs from the train station at Terminal 1 and will take you to Union Station (downtown) in 25 minutes at a cost of CAD\$12.35. From Union Station you can take a taxi or TTC transit to your final destination. If you choose to take public transportation from the airport, you can take the TTC Bus 192 Airport Rocket which goes to Kipling Station of the TTC Subway. Change to the eastbound subway at Kipling. The downtown area is between Spadina and Yonge stations. A single ride on the TTC costs CAD\$3.25.
- The conference venue is a 5 minute walk from St. George Station. You can find a <u>map to the venue here</u>. Please note that the Munk School has two buildings: the JSAC meeting will take place at the 1 Devonshire Place building on the corner of Devonshire and Hoskin Avenue.
- The banquet and keynote on October 13 will take place at a Japanese restaurant called *Yuzu No Hana* at 236 Adelaide Street West. It will include a sake tasting. The closest TTC subway stations are Osgoode and St. Andrew. <u>If you prefer to walk, it is about 30 minutes from the venue.</u>
