| INTERNIEDIALE | • The contestant has not stayed in Japan for more than six months in total since the age of six. |
| | Neither parent of the contestant is a native speaker of Japanese. |
| ADVANCED | There is no limit on the hours of study. |
| ADVANCED | • The contestant has not stayed in Japan for more than three years in total since the age of six. |
| | Both or either of the parents may be native speakers of Japanese language |
| OPEN | as long as the contestant is studying Japanese as a foreign language. |
| OI EIV | There is no limit on the hours of study. |
| | There are no restrictions on length of stay in Japan. |
