## 3. Qualifications

All applicants must:

- 1) be 18 years of age or older;
- 2) reside in Ontario (excluding the Ottawa and Kingston areas); and
- 3) have been studying Japanese as a foreign language.

Notes:

- All contestants must submit their speech to the Organizing Committee by email by 9:00 a.m. one day before the contest.
- All contestants must register at the reception desk by the predetermined time on the day of the contest.
- All contestants must attend the opening session, session of their category, and closing ceremony.
- If any concerns arise regarding a contestant's qualifications, the judging committee's decision will be final. The Organizing Committee will require the return of awards even after the contest has concluded if a false application is discovered or a contestant's performance is later regarded as having been dishonest.

## 4. Program Affiliation

- 1) Those who study Japanese at multiple institutions must apply from the institution with which they have been affiliated the longest.
- 2) If there is a Japanese program in the applicant's present institution that the applicant has not enrolled in, they must still be screened through that institution.
- 3) Those who do not have an affiliation with any Japanese institution/program may also apply. Please note that, however, applicants with a program affiliation will be given priority if we have a greater number of applications than the limit for each category.

## 5. Categories

Please see the conditions for each category below. Hours of studying Japanese includes studying at primary and secondary school. There is a limit to the maximum number of contestants for each category from each institution. The limit will be decided and announced by the Organizing Committee based on the results of an institutional survey conducted each year prior to the limit being set. Please refer to the website for details on our calculation of institution size and the number of eligible students per institution.

Notes:

- All qualifications must be met by the applicants as of March 3, 2023.
- Past winners of the Grand Prize or the First Prize should not participate in the same category in which the prize was won.
- Learners of Japanese who have experience in teaching Japanese either formally or informally must apply in the Open Category.
- Those who do not know which category they are eligible for should inquire with the Organizing Committee by email before they apply.

6. Regulations

- 1) Contestants are free to choose the title and subject of their speech. Preferred subjects are those related to Canada and Japan.
- 2) Speeches must be written by the contestants.
- 3) Contestants are allowed to prepare and use cue cards, but they may be penalized if they depend on these excessively.
- 4) Speeches must not include the name of the institution to which the contestant belongs.

7. Speech Length

- 1) Three minutes in the Beginner category, and four minutes in all other categories.
- 2) Those who exceed 10 seconds over the above limits will be subjected to a penalty.

8. Evaluation

- 1) There will be a panel of five judges composed of individuals from varying fields related to Japan.
- 2) The Organizing Committee is not involved in decision making.
- 3) The assessment criteria are provided on the homepage.

9. Certificates and Prizes

The winners in each category will be awarded certificates and prizes.

10. Participation in the National Japanese Speech Contest:

The first prize winner in each category may be invited to attend the National Japanese Speech Contest, which will be held at the Japan Foundation, Toronto, on Sunday, March 26, 2023.

Reference Form: Must be filled out by the representative of the Japanese institution/program to which the applicants belong.

Deadline: **Reference Form: No later than 5:00 p.m., Monday, February 6, 2023**

**Application Form: No later than 5:00 p.m., Wednesday, February 8, 2023**

Result announcement: Results will be announced by e-mail by Wednesday, February 15, 2023

Notes:

- No Reference Form will be required for those who do not have an affiliation with any Japanese institution/program. Instead, the organizing committee will conduct an interview either in person or online within a few days after the application deadline to determine the applicant's appropriate category.
- If you do not receive a confirmation email from the Organizing Committee within 48 hours after submitting your application, please contact the Committee.
